Take any size paper and make a mark for each year of your life, to celebrate your existence, your uniqueness, and honor the 1.5 million children whose lives were taken in the Holocaust. The Holocaust happened to children, children who never had the chance to grow into adults. Or the chance to have their own children.



Marks 4 Their Lives

Problem


Our country is currently being divided before our eyes. There is a growing disconnect to belonging and community. The economic, social, and inequalities the pandemic has made clear to all, unites us in making the American Dream a reality for every American.

Proposed Solution

To bring exposure to the damaging effects of division, and to start a global awareness art project on the societal benefits of working together. Creating and seeing these marks, is a living memorial, a reminder to set participants on a path to make a mark in your existence. The world is grateful to have each of us.

Objectives & Benefits

- Supports new Holocaust education Bill H.B.1213, signed into law 2020
- To gain experience in collaboration and communication skills, while working together on a project (if done as a group project)
- To develop and understand systems of visual language and symbols
- Develop awareness of elements of art (line, value, scale)
- Develop awareness of principles of art (harmony, variety, contrast, pattern)
- Develop skills of visual understanding of pleasing creative aesthetics
- Ability to participate individually as well as a member of a group, follow directions, and to use art materials properly
- To gain a better sense of self-awareness and of one's place in the world
- Awareness of the patterns, relationships, and part to whole gestalt
- Introduce cultural/historic references
- Introduction to artists who work in mixed media that speak about social change.
- Understanding of aesthetics of finished piece
- Self Esteem and positive reinforcement
- Knowledge of combining image with text.
- Demonstration of reflective thinking and interpretation
- Individual and group critique at end of workshop
- To write down, in a coherent or creative way, the meaning of the work of art produced





PROJECT DESCRIPTION

This is about the children. Every mark on a page means that we count, and those children still count. We must remember them and ensure a Holocaust and hate free world.

This is an international art project to engage as many participants and raise awareness to the current global division crisis. Instead let us come together and celebrate our similarities & difference.

The three objectives of the project

- 1.To Support the new Holocaust education Bill H.B.1213, signed into law 2020
- 2. amass 1.5 million marks, each representing a single child that lost their life while honoring each year of our lives.
- 3. To provide an empowering and collaborative experience for each participant through engagement in social issues and art making.

By visually representing the sheer volume of this astronomical count of deaths, we can better grasp the enormity of the Holocaust genocide. We are actually counting the 1.5 million marks and will include many in a final quilt.

Mark Making GUIDELINES:

You are welcome to create any design or single mark. There are no bad, ugly, or uncounted marks in this project. Simple or complex final submissions make the gestalt (the whole) more unique and beautiful. We encourage you to be creative! Artworks completed on simple scrap paper and printer paper are welcome! Bolder colors and higher quality materials & papers are also welcome. Please refer to our image gallery for inspiration and to see the wonderful variety of submissions.

Paper Requirements:

Paper can be any size, or material. If possible, we welcome the use of recycled papers. Mark your name, age, and home state on the back of your paper. If you can, please include how it felt to make your marks. Use a pencil/pen directly on the back so words don't bleed through the front.

A new national survey shows that Holocaust education in high school reflects gains not only in historical knowledge but also manifests in cultivating more empathetic, tolerant, and engaged students.

The survey was administered by Lucid Collaborative LLC and YouGov and was released today by Echoes & Reflections, a partnership program of ADL (the Anti-Defamation League), USC Shoah Foundation, and Yad Vashem, which provides Holocaust educational programs and resources for middle and high school teachers.
